I. Background

a) C-PreP Development - Growing out of challenges and lessons learned in Haiti after the 2010 earthquake, the Port Resiliency Program (PreP) began in 2012 as an effort to improve the resiliency of airports and seaports in disaster-prone areas of the Caribbean and Latin America. With strong sponsorship and support from FedEx and Miami International Airport (MIA), the program was pilot tested at Las Americas International Airport in Santo Domingo, the Dominican Republic, in 2013. Lessons learned there were applied to create PreP 2.0 that was successfully applied in 2015 at Juan Santamaria International Airport in San Jose, Costa Rica. The fully operational PreP program was delivered to Jamaica's three international airports in July 2016. In early 2017 a PreP Workshop was delivered to the Merida International Airport and its parent company Aeropuertos del Sureste (ASUR) including five other international airports in Mexico: Cancún International Airport, Cozumel International Airport, Villahermosa International Airport, Puerto Vallarta International Airport, and Mazatlán International Airport. Subsequently, in 2017 the government of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines requested the implementation of a PreP Workshop to improve the emergency and resiliency plans of the Argyle International Airport. By the mid of 2018 three workshops were implemented in three vulnerable Caribbean islands: Antigua & Barbuda, St. Lucia and Dominica. During that year, the program developed to a more comprehensive approach emphasizing the participation of the other local stakeholders and communities, becoming the Community Port Resiliency Program (C-PreP). Since then, C-PreP has carried out several other workshop (virtual and in-presence) in different countries and airports including seminars in Merida, Yucatan, Mexico; San Juan, Puerto Rico; the Dominican Republic; Georgetown, Guyana; and Paramaribo, Suriname.

b) Vulnerability of the LAC and the Caribbean Region – Countries in the Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) region experience a range of natural hazards, including droughts, earthquakes, floods, forest fires, hurricanes, landslides, tsunamis, and volcanoes. El Niño and La Niña phenomena occur periodically, exacerbating the impacts of hydrometeorological events in the LAC region. Some LAC countries have special vulnerabilities as they lie directly in the path of tropical hurricanes, including Puerto Rico, the Dominican Republic, and the Yucatan Peninsula of Mexico. Over the next few decades LAC countries will continue to be hit by severe hurricanes and other natural disasters. Inadequate disaster risk management practices compound the humanitarian and economic cost of damage from natural disasters. Natural disasters in the Caribbean are becoming more ferocious and frequent even relative to small states. The devastations of Category 5 hurricanes Maria and Irma (both in September 2017) demonstrated how powerful storms can lead to widespread destruction, loss of life, and weaker economic growth prospects.

c) C-PreP 2023 Workshops - As a follow up and continuous monitoring of the disaster response capacity of C-PreP partners and focused region, in 2023, OAA/ART carried out the following C-PreP Workshops:

- On March 9-10, the “*XVIII Seminario Internacional de Huracanes/XVIII International Hurricane Seminar*”, virtual event carried out in Merida, Mexico in close collaboration with ASUR (Aeropuertos del Sur de Mexico)

- On May 24-25, the C-PreP Workshop in Puerto Plata, Dominican Republic.

This report provides information about the development and implementation of the above-mentioned 2023 C-PreP Workshops.

d) Location Vulnerability Overview

Merida, Yucatan, Mexico

There's no getting away from the fact that many parts of Mexico susceptible to hurricanes. México is particularly vulnerable to hurricanes on both its shores. Hurricanes are an accepted part of the climate that they have their own seasons: May 15 to November 30 in the Pacific and June 1 to November 30 in the Atlantic. The effects of these powerful storms can be devastating and tragic¹. Because of the location of the Yucatan Peninsula, conveniently juxtaposed between the Caribbean and the Gulf of Mexico, it is highly probable that at some point between June and November, there is high possibility of a hurricane alert around the region of Merida.



Dominican Republic

The Dominican Republic is considered a hotspot for natural disasters. The country is exposed to droughts, earthquakes, flooding, hurricanes, landslides, temperature extremes (heat waves), tropical storms, and tsunamis. Climate change is expected to increase the risk and intensity of excess rainfall, storm surges, and hurricanes in the Caribbean, with relatively higher impacts in the Dominican Republic². Dominican Republic has been in the hurricane eye: 76 reports show the vulnerability of the island of Hispaniola that is divided with Haiti. Between the different categories, winds and central pressure, they were no more than 44 hurricanes that affected houses and entire districts, whereas 32 tropical storms affected the country³.



To address these weather vulnerabilities, both Guyana and Suriname have been focusing on disaster preparedness, infrastructure development, and climate change adaptation strategies. These include improving early warning systems, constructing flood mitigation infrastructure, enhancing

coastal protection measures, promoting sustainable land and water management practices, and working toward reducing greenhouse gas emissions to mitigate climate change impacts.

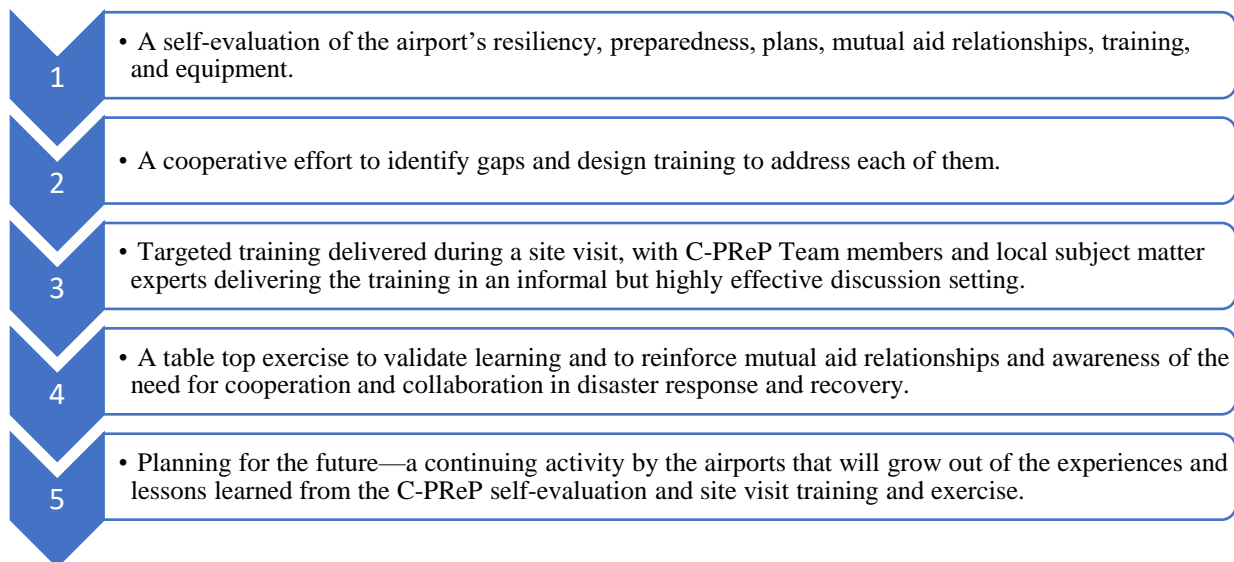
II. C-PReP Basics

The C-PReP program brings together key stakeholders, including senior policymakers, public, private, and multilateral development partners, to explore incentives to shift the focus of policies towards building resilience and innovative disaster risk financing policies and instruments that would help in this regard.

C-PReP has three overarching goals:

- To speed an airport's ability to restore function to allow humanitarian aid as quickly as possible after a disaster strike.
- To speed a region's, an island's, or a nation's economic recovery by restoring full airport function as quickly as possible.
- To reconcile these two goals so that the benefits of both are maximized and conflicting demands for the use of a recovering airport are minimized.

In order to achieve these goals, C-PReP engages in a highly collaborative and interactive process with the airports that normally includes five steps:



III. Main C-PReP partners, collaborators and experts.

Thanks to the support and partnership with FedEx, in 2023 OAA/ART was able to carry out the C-PReP Workshops in close collaboration with the following main partners:

1. FedEx

The C-PReP 2023 initiatives were not only supported financially by FedEx, but also by the excellent representation of key local FedEx personnel. In the case of the Seminar in Puerto Plata, Dominican Republic, FedEx participated with a key note words at the inauguration ceremony, as well as a presentation by Mr. Rolando Medina, Managing Director of Operations at FedEx Puerto Rico and Caribbean. His presentation was key to the C-PReP Workshop success by addressing the topic of “Immediate transport of essential commodities in emergency situations.” Mr. Medina provided key insights in the opening ceremony, and actively participated in the two-day event, sharing his in-depth knowledge and experiences with the other participants.



2. ASUR (Aeropuertos del Sur de Mexico)

The “XVIII Seminario Internacional de Huracanes/XVIII International Hurricane Seminar”, virtual event was carried out in Merida, Mexico in close collaboration with ASUR (Aeropuertos del Sur de Mexico). ASUR is a Mexican leading international airport operator with a portfolio of concessions to operate, maintain and develop 16 airports in the Americas. This comprises nine airports in southeast Mexico (Merida, Cozumel, Villahermosa, Oaxaca, Veracruz, Huatulco, Tapachula, Minatitlan, and Cancun, the most important tourist destination in Mexico). ASUR also has airport concessions in the Caribbean and Latin America, and six airports in northern Colombia, including Medellin international airport, the second busiest in Colombia. ASUR is also a partner in Aerostar Airport Holdings, LLC, operator of the Luis Muñoz Marín International Airport serving the capital of Puerto Rico, San Juan. ASUR was the first airport group in the world to be traded simultaneously in the New York Stock Exchange (NYSE) and in the Bolsa Mexicana de Valores (BMV). ASUR is one of the top four emerging market companies in the transportation and transportation infrastructure sector included in the Dow Jones Sustainability Emerging Markets Index.

3. UNITAR/CIFAL MERIDA

The “XVIII Seminario Internacional de Huracanes/XVIII International Hurricane Seminar” was implemented in close coordination and with the leadership of ASUR. This seminar and the C-PReP Puerto Plata 2023 Seminar, were both implemented under the auspices of the “Center for International Formation of Authorities and Leaders” (CIFAL) Merida of the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR).



4. AERODOM (Aeropuertos Dominicanos Siglo XXI)

Dominican Airports Siglo XXI (Aerodom) has been a part of VINCI Airports worldwide airport platform since April 2016. It manages and operates six airports in the Dominican Republic, under a concession contract granted by the State, which runs until 2030. Airports include: the International Airports of the Americas, José Francisco Peña Gómez, in Santo Domingo; President Dr. Joaquín Balaguer, in Santo Domingo Norte; Gregorio Luperón, in Puerto Plata; María Montez, in Barahona and President Juan Bosch in the province of Samaná; in addition, the Arroyo Barril Aerodrome, also located in Samaná. Aerodom handles an annual average of 5 million passengers in some 76,610 aircraft movements and through its airport network 49 airlines connect the Dominican Republic with 58 cities in the world.

The goal of ASHONORTE is to preserve, improve and promote the sustainable tourism development of the entire province of Puerto Plata and its municipalities as a "Tourist Destination", including promoting education, culture, history, society, commerce, industry, environment, child protection, public safety, and sustainable tourism. ASHONORTE participated as one the main organizers of the C-PRReP 2023 Puerto Plata Workshop, together with AERODOM and OAA.

6. Government of Dominican Republic

C-PRReP Workshop in Puerto Plata, Dominican Republic was carried out in collaboration with the government of the Dominican Republic. The C-PRReP 2023 Puerto Plata Workshop was officially inaugurated by Ms. Claritza Rochtte, Governor of the Providence of Puerto Plata. The workshop also included the participation of technical government experts including: the Director of Operations of the Emergency Operations Centre (COE), Director of Civil Defense in Puerto Plata, the Deputy Technical Director of the National Meteorological Office (ONAMET), and the Director of Risk Management and Disaster Attention of the Ministry of Public Health. Coordination with the government also included the identification and selection of the main topics to be discussed, the format of the event, the logistics and the identification and invitation to organizations to be invited and expert speakers.

IV. C-PRReP Focus

The objective of the three 2023 C-PRReP workshops was to provide disaster resilience and emergency management training to key airport personnel, government agencies, NGOs, and other

key stakeholders; thus, expecting to save and protect the life of about millions of people living in Mexico, and the Dominican Republic..

The C-PreP team was engaged to deliver two day workshops in each location. The first Mexico seminar was focused on airport’s hurricane preparedness and response, and the Dominican Republic workshop in general disaster preparedness and management. The two events aimed to improve the resiliency of disaster planning, to ensure optimal interoperability and coordination among agencies and other resources in the event of crisis.

V. C-PreP Preparation Activities.

The C-PreP team held several planning meetings, as well as conference calls with ASUR, AERODOM, and ASHONORTE to better understand the context of the seminar/workshops as well as coordinate logistical arrangements. The OAA/ART, the C-PreP team, ASUR and, AERODOM/ASHONORTE partners formed working planning groups and discussed plans for the organization of the seminars/workshops and agreed on the dates, location/format, list of potential participants and speakers, and general logistics.

The C-PreP Team gathered information on the background of Mexico’s and the Dominican Republic’s airports, their conditions and the preparation and response for hurricanes, flooding and other emergencies, as appropriate, in order to adapt speaker’s presentations, training materials and workshop exercises according to the needs and realities of the participating airports within this context.

Based on the above-mentioned preparations, OAA/ART together with ASUR and AERODM/ASHONORTE, sent out the invitations to potential participants of the seminar/workshops accordingly.

In addition, millions of people in Mexico, and the Dominican Republic, and the other counties and participating airports indirectly benefited through the 2023 C-PreP seminar/workshops, as the program aims to save lives of the communities represented in the airports and organizations participating in the events. The seminar/workshops were developed with a customized training curriculum to better fit the needs of airports in Mexico and the Dominican Republic and the other participating countries and airports.

VII. C-PreP Seminars/Workshops Development.

All planned activities were successfully implemented. The 2023 C-PreP seminars/workshops were carried out as planned: March 9-10, 2023 in Merida, Mexico; and May 24-25, 2023 in Puerto Plata, Dominican Republic.

In the case of the 2023 C-PreP workshops in Guyana and Suriname, the C-PreP Team of Experts after a desk review of background and context materials of each country and airports, when arrived in country the team visited the Puerto Plata (POP) airport for a tour of the installations, providing an opportunity to the team to carry out a rapid assessment and gap/needs identification, so that the team could provide suitable and context appropriate recommendations and training content.

The seminar/workshops provided participants with a broad range of topics related to emergency preparedness and response, including:

- Challenges in Hurricane Forecasting,
- Resilience to Disasters at the Airports through Community Engagement,
- Emergency Planning for Airlines,
- Alternate Airports During the Emergency,
- How to Avoid Mistakes in the Line of Communication,
- Care of Essential Employees and Families,
- Emergency Preparation, Recuperation and Action,
- Post-Disaster Actions in Airports,

A copy of the agendas of the Seminars can be found in the annexes of this report.

Each presentation and discussion offered an opportunity for questions and/or comments by the attendees. During the presentations, several key gaps were identified as priority to include in each organization's emergency and preparedness plan.

Also, in the C-PreP workshop in Puerto Plata, Dominican Republic, the event included the development of a Table Top Exercise (TTX) simulating a hurricane approaching the area and with the consideration measures and protocols to manage emergencies. The TTX was conducted the second afternoon of the workshop. The objective of the exercise was to put into practice knowledge acquired through the expert's presentations and discussions and assess learning outcomes and airport/government /community readiness to deal with a disaster of significant proportions. The TTX were carried out through group discussions. as follows:

The purpose of the exercise was to present a real-life scenario to identify any gaps in the process and procedures based on the expert opinions of the participating panelists, determining the

effectiveness of responses and interactions between and among the different agencies and/or organizations represented in the virtual seminar.

In general terms, OAA/ART confirms that all C-PreP planned activities were implemented on target and successfully completed according to project timeline. Contingencies are not recorded in the C-PreP program files.

VIII. Monitoring and Evaluation of Impact and Results

C-PreP implementation contributed to build the disaster preparedness and resilience of participants by: 1. contributing to identify and address weaknesses and build on their existing strengths in order to improve their resiliency and disaster response. Participants were presented with risks self-evaluation approaches as well as identification of gaps in preparedness and disaster resiliency, 2. Assisting government; communities and stakeholders enhanced existing societal and organizational strengths and minimize weaknesses through risk assessment.

In the case of C-PreP Puerto Plata, Dominican Republic, the workshop helped improve the communication among stakeholders. The C-PreP team focused their presentations and panel discussions with an approach that provided the participants with the opportunity to share their input and views from the emergency response and resilience perspective. The initiatives also fostered networking and collaboration among airports for disaster planning and emergency response, as it included the active participation of representatives from different key stakeholder organizations.

Both seminars had the participation of 228 (142 in the Merida Seminar, 86 in the Dominican Republic) key personnel of ports, airports, government representatives, NGOs, airlines, logistics firms, and other stakeholders:

- Number of participants trained in the C-PreP seminars: 801 participants.
(* some participated in both seminars.

In addition, as part of the monitoring and evaluation efforts of the C-PreP program, ASUR, AERODOM, and OAA/ART carried out follow up virtual meetings with the participating airports in order to ensure that these airports have applied the lessons learned and key recommendations of C-PreP seminars/workshop, and to identify special areas of support needed to improve their disaster preparedness and response plans.

Some participants of the seminar/workshops provided the following feedback through the C-PreP Evaluation Tool:

- “The Seminar was excellent”
- “The event was very helpful. I do not have additional recommendations”
- “Topics discussed were very comprehensive and practical at the same time”
- “Excellent and very good logistics and arrangements”
- “I liked the opportunity for questions and answers and comments after each presentation”
- “The TableTop Exercise was a great way to put into practice what we discussed theoretically”
- “I would like to have the opportunity to continue to participate in these seminars”
- “Consider providing more time for group discussions”

Some participants in of the 2023 C-PreP Dominican Republic workshop also sent testimonies of and positive feedback on the impact and usefulness of the workshop. This is included as one Annex of this report.

IX. Key Factors and Recommendations.

Based on the feedback obtained from participants and the discussion with OAA/ART’s partners including ASUR, and AERODOM, below are some key factors that contributed to the success of the seminars include:

- Proper planning is crucial to ensure the success of the seminar/workshops. Event planning involved going over all procedures, and logistics, equipment, team, speakers, agenda, materials, invitations, registrations, etc.
- Making the content of the event to the needs of the participants, including information that is relevant and that addresses gaps and needs while considering the context and reality faced by the participants and stakeholder organizations.

- Choosing a broad and qualified range of speaker experts, with the ability to effectively share their skills, knowledge and expertise with the participants.
- Good coordination, communication and engagement with local governments and key stakeholder agencies in each for both seminars.
- Active participation of seminar attendees, especially in the identification of gaps and preparedness/resilience actions. This includes involvement of key representatives of the governments, airlines, seaports/airports, fuel supply/utility companies.
- In the case of the C-PreP Dominican Republic workshops, generating discussion spaces contributed to a better involvement of participants, it is critical to listening first-hand concerns related to emergency response protocols, and other aspects. It helps to prepare participants for the TTX of a disaster scenario, as it requires a lot of participation.

X. Next Steps

Airports in the LAC and Caribbean region continue to contact C-PreP for continued support and to explore the possibility of carrying out future C-PreP seminar/workshops. This is the case for example of the Dominican Republic. The C-PreP Team will continue to explore the possibility to carry out a C-PreP seminar/workshop in the region, and partner with other relevant potential partners.
