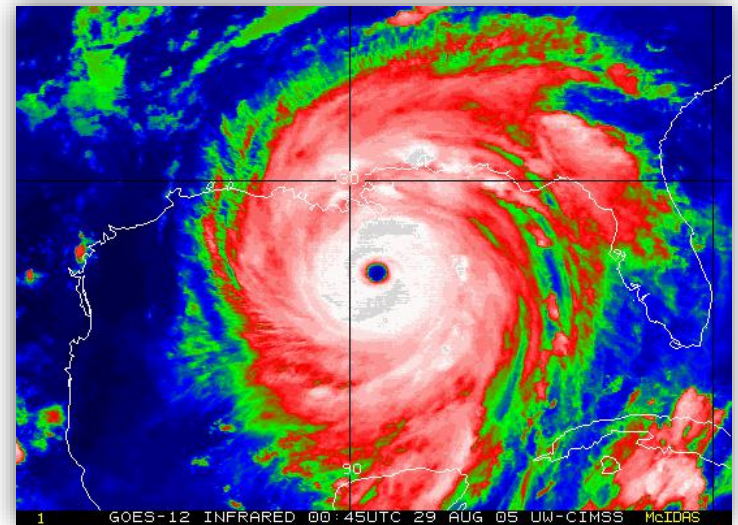

OAA's aim is to reduce the suffering and increase the self-sufficiency of the most vulnerable groups in the Americas.



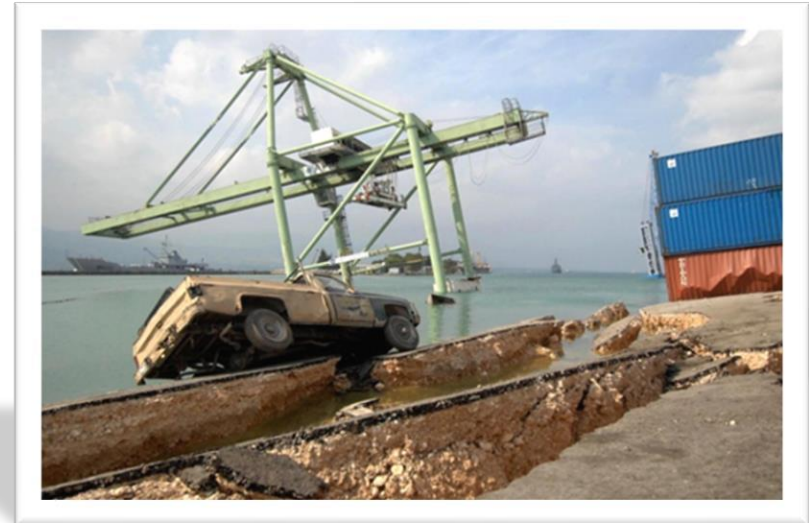
Haiti's Earthquake

- On January 12, 2010, a massive earthquake shook Haiti.
- The scale of this disaster was unprecedented in the Western Hemisphere.

The United Nations reported:

- More than 220,000 people died in the earthquake.
- 2.3 million of people homeless.

In the first months following the earthquake, the government was unable to take charge of the coordination of the for relief efforts and of the international response.



Disaster Preparedness

- Coaching in self-evaluation of risks and current plans.
- Identification of emergency preparedness gaps and build on their existing strengths.
- Helping to close targeted gaps through custom-tailored training modules and a Table Top Exercise.



An innovative program designed to accelerate airport and seaport reopening following a crisis.

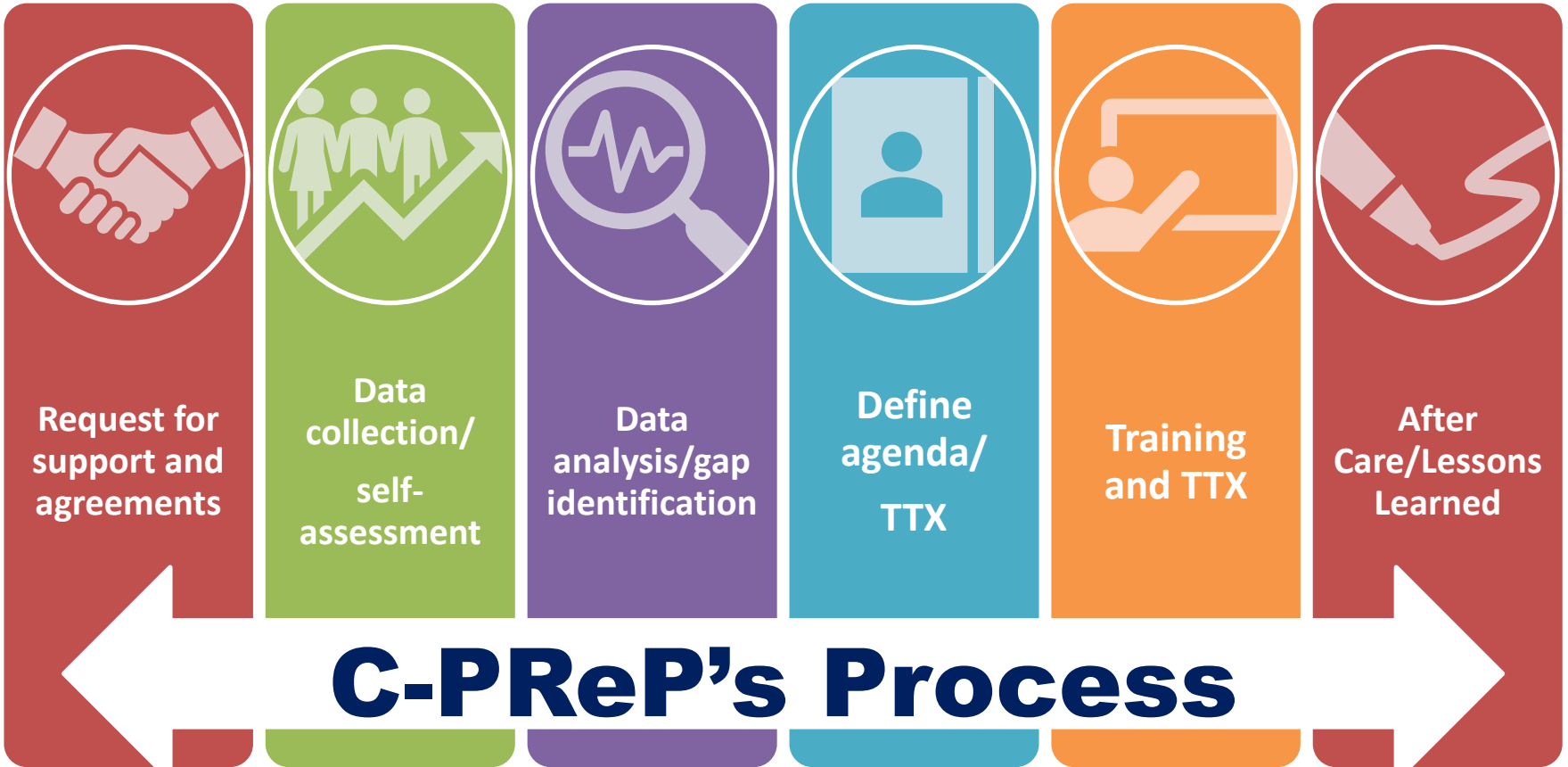
